



1 Emmeiji Temple

The temple is believed to have been founded in the Heian period, when the main

believed to be about 1000 years old, and are famous for the autumn leaves.



### 2 Kanshinji Temple

The Kanshinji Temple is believed to have been founded in the late Asuka period (7th century) and was where Kukai taught Shingon Buddhism. In the middle ages, it had close relations with the court and the warrior clans, and still has many buildings connected with this time. 




## 3 Amanosan Kongoji Temple

Said to have been founded by Gyoki in the Nara period, it is nicknamed "Nyonin Koya." During the Northern and Southern Courts period, when the imperial court was split, there were two "provisional palaces" here, separated by a wall. This legacy is why Kongoji has a lot of historical and cultural heritage.




